Ingredients

Ham Pinwheels

- 1 tbs cream cheese,
- 1 wholegrain wrap,
- 40g ham leg, sliced
- ½ carrot, grated



Method

1. Spread cream cheese evenly over wrap.
2. Place ham and carrot down the centre of the wrap, then roll firmly to enclose filling. Trim edges and cut into four pinwheels.

Ingredients

Snacks
